

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

for following the TerraCert model: training, recognition and micro-credentials for the green transition

This Memorandum of Understanding is a declaration of interest addressed to all individuals and organisations wishing to be recognised as **followers** of the model developed by the Erasmus+ project TerraCert for Certification and Micro-credentials in Regenerative Agriculture.
